# ROCK EAGLE 2016 September 21-23, 2016

As you may or may not know, the 5th grade will be taking an overnight trip to Rock Eagle 4-H Center. This packet contains specifics of the trip, including emergency information, permission slips, rules and a list of what to bring. On site, breakfast, lunch and dinner will be provided. Additionally, snacks will be provided for the way there and back. Students must bring a reusable water bottle with them as they will use that daily to stay hydrated.

#### 5th Grade Assessment Fee:

Due to the quantity and quality of 5th grade activities, there is a 5th grade assessment fee of \$230. Families are asked to pay this amount in full at the beginning of the year, or in two installments, with the first installment to be paid by Wednesday, August 31 and the second installment due by December 15th. (Scholarships are available, if needed; please discuss with your child's teacher). Please make checks payable to Morris Brandon PTA. Checks can be placed in an envelope marked Rock Eagle in 5th Grade Slot in the Bee Box.

# On Wednesday, September 21st, students need to arrive at Brandon between 7:30-8:00am and report to their classroom as they normally would.

PLEASE be on time! Do not drop students off in the front of the school. Use the lower lot carpool line or if your child needs help with their luggage then park in the lower lot or in legal parking areas along Dover and walk them to the school. Children that typically arrive by bus may do so if they are able to navigate the bus with luggage. Once students assemble in their classrooms they will be given instructions and buses to Rock Eagle will depart promptly at 8:45am in order to reach Rock Eagle by 10:30am.

### On Friday, September 23rd, buses should arrive back at Brandon @3pm.

We will make every effort to arrive at Brandon on time. Please make arrangements for your child to be picked up at school at 3pm sharp. The teachers & students come back very tired so PLEASE do not be late.

# ROCK EAGLE 2016 WHAT TO BRING AND WEAR

#### Please remember:

- PLEASE LABEL ALL ARTICLES WITH YOUR CHILD'S NAME.
- Do not bring items that are not on the list unless approved ahead of time by the teacher accompanying your child on the trip. Please do not bring: CANDY, GUM, CELL PHONES, IPODS, ELECTRONIC DEVICES
- Limit luggage to one bag and a sleeping bag. Alternately, a fitted sheet and flat sheet may be sent instead of a sleeping bag. Pillows with pillow cases are provided. Avoid sending unnecessary items as the children are responsible for carrying their own bags.
- ONLY OLD CLOTHES ARE NEEDED. New clothes may be ruined by heavy outdoor use.
- SANDALS MAY NOT BE WORN anywhere on the grounds of Rock Eagle unless they have a strap (Crocs with straps are permitted).
- The two most important items on this list are a water bottle and a raincoat. We are outside for the majority of the time even when it is hot or raining. Please be prepared.

#### ON WEDNESDAY:

- Bring a reusable water bottle filled with water.
- Weather permitting, wear a T-Shirt, Shorts, Tennis shoes, socks and a Hat(if desired)
- Please Apply Sunscreen before leaving if appropriate as we will arrive and go straight to classes
- Students that take medication on the trip will need to drop off the medication with their home room teacher Wednesday morning and communicate how it is to be administered.

#### WHAT TO BRING FOR WEDNESDAY-FRIDAY:

- 1 sleeping bag or twin size bedding pillows and pillow cases are provided
- 1 towel/2 washcloths/1 hand towel
- Toiletries (hand soap, toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo, deodorant, hair brush, etc.)
- Hat/Cap or Visor and Sunglasses
- Sunscreen and Insect Repellant
- Canteen Money (Optional: suggested amount \$20-30(\$5-10 if just for snacks/\$30 if the child wants a t-shirt and snacks)
- 1 set of sleepwear (pajamas, sweatpants/sweatshirt or T-shirt/shorts)
- 2 pairs of jeans or long pants
- 3 pairs of shorts (appropriate length for hiking and climbing no "short" shorts)
- 3 shirts, a mix of long and short sleeve
- 1 jacket, sweatshirt or sweater (may need it for bus)
- 1 poncho or 1 raincoat with hood or hat. NO umbrellas please.
- 3 pairs of underwear
- 5 pairs of socks (due to changing wet socks)
- 2 pairs of closed-toe, good walking shoes and 1 pair of water shoes or sandals with straps that can get wet/muddy and shower shoes if desired,
- 1 trash bag/large Ziplock bag for wet or dirty clothes
- Quiet material (cards, books, etc.) for the bus ride
- Flashliaht
- Teddy Bear (or whatever your child likes to sleep with)
- 1 reusable water bottle

### Class List and Preparations

Herpetology: Students get the opportunity to handle, observe, and learn about reptiles and amphibians. Characteristics and adaptations of snakes, turtles, alligators, salamanders, and more will be discussed. Also, many of the misconceptions about these beneficial, but often misunderstood animals will be dispelled.

Watershed Studies: Explore a Piedmont watershed and discover how humans can impact local water bodies. Students will sample aquatic organisms in our streams and discuss how watershed assessment can help monitor the health of our groundwater and water bodies. Final thoughts will include discussions focusing on students' actions for a healthier watershed. Students will need to bring old shoes that can get wet and muddy.

Lake Ecology: Be prepared to get your feet wet in this fascinating class. Students will use dip nets to collect and identify common organisms found in Rock Eagle Lake. Adaptations to an aquatic environment and characteristics of lakes will be discussed through exploration and hands-on activities. Students will need to bring old shoes that can get wet and muddy.

Challenge Course: Groups focus on the principles of team-building by working through a progression of initiatives and elements. Each activity will focus on a different aspect of the team. These aspects may include goal setting, trust, problem solving, planning, or group cohesion. Most groups will progress onto the low ropes course during this class. Add fun to team-building and you have a recipe for success. This course is physically and mentally challenging to groups.

**Pioneer Life:** Students will participate in chores associated with life on a farm during early Georgia history. From the early 1800's to the mid 1900's, chores include drawing water, laundry, and gardening. Students will tour the original home site and features of the Scott family.

Raptors (evening): Visit with our Rock Eagle Raptors in this class. Students will gain an understanding on the ecological importance of raptors and their special adaptations that allow them to be the top of the food chain!

Nature Hike (evening): Experience the sights and sounds of Rock Eagle at night. Students will hike Rock Eagle trails and learn how nocturnal animals use their senses at night.

Activities may vary due to seasonal constraints and weather. There will also be games, recreation time and a campfire.

### **Emergency Information**

Students will be under adult supervision during the trip, and the teachers and chaperones demand order and structure 24 hours a day. This ensures a conducive learning environment, but more importantly, it means that your child will always be in a safe and secure surrounding as he/she explores the natural surroundings.

#### Medical Emergencies

In the event of an accident that needs hospital treatment, an ambulance or chaperone will transport the student to St. Mary's Good Samaritan Hospital, 5401 Lake Oconee Parkway, Greensboro, GA 30642 which is located twenty minutes away. At least one chaperone will have a personal vehicle to be used in case of an emergency. In such an event, a teacher/staff member will contact you as soon as possible. Directions are attached should an emergency arise.

#### Medications

Label all medications with your child's name. All medications must be given to their homeroom teacher upon arrival at school Wednesday morning. Teachers are responsible for administering any daily medication. You will get the medicine back from your child's homeroom teacher upon pick up Wednesday. Inhalers/Epi-Pens and other medicines taken on an urgent as needed basis may be carried by the students on the bus or given to their chaperone that morning. Once at Rock Eagle, the Chaperone for that child will be responsible for carrying it around for the duration of the trip. The law requires that all medications be in their original container with written instructions for dispensing the medication. The attached medication form must be filled out and returned by Wednesday, August 31st. By law, any medication (even non prescription) cannot be administered without a doctor's instructions and signature on the form. Therefore, if you sending any medicine with your child, fill the form out in its entirety and have it signed by your child's doctor. If your child has medication/complete forms with the school nurse you don't need to get new forms signed - we can use the ones on file.

#### Family Emergencies

Please DO NOT CALL the Rock Eagle 4-H Center except in the case of emergency. When the buses arrive at the center, an e-mail will be sent to let parents and staff know that we have arrived safely. We should arrive no later than 10:30am. Families may call the administration office at (706) 484-2899 in case of an emergency. If it is after hours, call the security guard at (706) 484-2821. If it is after hours, and you have an emergency, you can reach Ms. Harron at (678) 429-4809.

# Be Prepared for Classes


- Must wear shirt and shoes at all times (No flip-flops; sandals only if they have a back-strap).
